

WANTED VOLUNTEERS

Our lodge runs 99% on the labor of volunteers. What do we do? What is planned?

- 4th of July Parade and picnic
- Snack bar 10 times a month every Tuesday and Thursday and one Saturday a month
- Dinners 8 to 10 times a month, three Wednesdays, 4 to 5 Fridays and a Saturday.
- Bingo each Thursday
- Visitations with members of the VA community.
- Food and magazine drives 4 times a year.
- 50/50 raffles.
- Queen of Hearts game each Tuesday.
- Membership committee: assist with recruitment, retention, and engagement.
- Lodge Olympics, where we travel to other lodges and compete in cooking and sports related competition.
- Mystery bus, where members are taken to lodges, unknown which lodges until we arrive. This gives us the opportunity to see others in their lodge environment.
- Bus to Umatilla youth camp to meet the staff of the camp and be exposed to all the Florida State Elks organization does throughout this state.
- A day at the Rays, a bus to see the Tampa Bay Rays play in Pinellas County. It is a statewide function. Last year there were about 1400 Elks in attendance.
- Hall rentals and catering that generates income for our lodge and charity programs.
- Communication: individuals overseeing the Bugle, our website, our calendars, Facebook, dinner and event flyers, contact with the media to promote our events, bulletin board and digital TV information in the lounge and other mechanisms we use to get the word out to our members.
- Christmas gift and wrapping. We post a list of children and information on their wish list.
- Back to school support. Supplies for teachers and students.
- Thanksgiving dinner on Thanksgiving.
- Toy collection with Walgreens.
- Collecting supply for active-duty service members.
- Member recruitment dinners.
- MacDill dinner in November (Guests by invitation only).
- Photographer: members to assist in capturing what we do.
- Entertainment: Booking of our entertainment is handled by a member.
- Bar support: The bar manager maintains fiscal control; orders supplies and goods. Sees that the bar is maintained in a safe and health manner.
- Kitchen support: In addition to cooking food in the kitchen, equipment and the kitchen from time to time must be deep cleaned. This requires removing the equipment out of the kitchen, cleaning and returning. As that is happening, stripping and waxing the floor occurs.
- Food buyer: This member is responsible to purchase much of the food and supplies for kitchen functions.
- Hall rental: A member meets with prospective parties to answer any questions on renting the hall. This person also handles the rental contract.
- Ground keeper: From time to time, members trim trees, remove clutter from drain line and spouts, blow leaves from entrances to reduce accidents and maintain our flowerpots and outside patio areas.
- Building maintenance: Painting, fixing a leaking toilet, and generally much of the same maintenance we do in our own homes.
- Accounting and record keeping: We maintain records and file reports as required by law and Elk rules.
- Anti drug campaign: MCing fishing events to impress upon the younger crowd the dangers of drugs.
- Visits with Willis Peters Exceptional School to entertain and assist children and their families with their children that are physically and emotionally delayed.
- Coordinating the rental of our hall for car, coin, and other shows.



There are many activities and functions that demand our labor to accomplish the goal of Elkdom:

I AM ASKING THAT OUR MEMBERS ASSIST IN OUR MISSION TO CARE AND SHARE. Share 8 hours a month. Many of the tasks mentioned can be done in the comfort of your home and on a schedule that is not overly demanding.

Yes, many actual require you be in the lodge and do tasks of a physical nature. To put in in perspective, your labor, had you been paid to perform, is donated to our lodge. If we have a rental, generating \$1200, \$600 in bar sales and \$1100 in food sales, your labor helped to generate that \$2900 in profit. IT is that income that pays the \$3000 electric bill, the \$600 trash bill, and supports much of what we do in our community.

SUSTAINING DONATIONS

As many of you know, our lodge is a fraternal organization of a parent entity, The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE). As a chapter/lodge of the BPOE, we have an obligation to support the parent BPOE. The BPOE is divided into states/regions throughout the United States. Florida is one of the largest of these states. The Florida State Elks Association is the body that operates and oversees the 98 lodges and 88,000 members in Florida as an extension of the BPOE.

These two organizations do not have members or events; but they are operationally are indispensable to each individual lodge. These two entities provide our lodge tens of thousands of dollars to fund our community activities. We have always received more than we have contributed.

Upon turning down our driveway to our lodge, there is a sign that states we have contributed more than \$1.3 million to our community. If the math is correct, our 56-year-old lodge has provided on average more than \$23,000 per year over the past 56 years. It is safe to say we provide more today that we did in 1989.

With this in mind, I am asking that our members become a sustaining donor to these two organizations, The BPOE and the Florida State Elks Association. A sustaining contribution, each month in the amount of 63 cents a day, which is \$19 a month to one or both can be expected to garner a great return to our lodge.

Those that join the sustaining donor program by July 31, 2024, will be celebrated with a formal dinner of lobster, crab cakes, filet mignon, along with a spread of appetizers, salads, desserts and side dishes.

The Florida State Elks Association, Harry Anna Fund, supports the world class youth camp and provides therapy services to more than 600 children each week throughout the state.

Your donation will assist our state elks and our local community with services to many in need.

Your monthly contribution will be recognized with a certificate and your name will be added to the wall of sustaining donors. Thank you for your ability to assist our lodge, community, and those in need throughout this state. During your initiation into our lodge, these words were shared, "the daily gifts we bestow increase our own riches" and "the real benefactor of mankind counts his store in what is given, not in what is saved."

I fully understand many of us are not sitting on a pile of money, this article is not an attempt to demean or harass any member, I do not know the financial status of our members, I am simply asking those that are able to please think about the benefits of being an Elk and how we can use our station in life to change those that are struggling and bring them into our Elks family.
