It is that time of year..... Dues must be paid by April 1st. There is a coupon on Page 8 with specific information.


The 500 Club



One of those partners, Guided Path Foundation, is new to our homeless initiative group and we are happy to help them in their endeavors to serve those in most need. Gracepoint has continued needing our bags on a monthly basis and they are very appreciative of this donation since they have seen an increase in their homeless clients. Another partner that has donated feminine hygiene products to the bags of brotherly love is Global Girls Initiative. Discussions are in the works about conducting a limited homeless outreach in the coming months and we will keep all our members apprised of the outcome once we know. Baby steps are still being taken due to the pandemic, but safety is of utmost importance and that is what everyone is striving for in these talks. We continue to have meetings in our own area with partners close by to keep aiding the homeless through various organizations that help with basic needs of housing and food. Again, we thank all our members for their continued support and generous donations. Elks Care, Elks Share rings true with each donation and act of kindness to those in need. We will pick up any travel size hygiene items or shelf stable food that you may have if you are unable to get to the lodge to drop them off.
